Whistle & Awareness

War Against Rape (W.A.R.) has approved a year-long pilot program to go into Karachi communities holding awareness sessions and handing out whistles with the "War Against Rape" logo printed on the whistle. The whistles cost approximately 70 cents each.

The W.A.R. organization's professional employees who are trained in holding awareness sessions will conduct this important work. Whenever possible, the media will be included to further spread awareness.

The whistles could actually prevent sexual violence. The organization will collect feedback and assess the program's effectiveness over the year. It is our intention that this campaign help communities and individuals to help themselves.
