Pakistan Passes Anti-Rape and Anti-Honour Killing Bills

War Against Rape (WAR), Karachi expresses its immense pleasure on the Government's passage of the Anti-Rape Laws (Criminal Laws Amendment) Bill 2014 and the Anti Honor Killing Bill. WAR congratulates the Government and WARs ally organizations for their untiring contribution.

The passage of the Anti-Rape bill will ultimately be beneficial for rape survivors. Court case processing times will be significantly reduced to 3 months whereas previously it was between 5-7 years. Medical testing and extraction of DNA of both victim and perpetrator will be made mandatory.

WAR hopes that this will encourage more rape survivors to come forward to report rape crimes.

The next most important step after passage of the bills is immediate implementation. WAR urges the government to ensure its effective execution in order to reduce crimes of sexual violence against women, children and the transgender community

As far as recommendations are concerned following this, there is a need for more female Medico-Legal Officers for appropriate examination and collection of evidence and consideration needs to be given to the prospect of DNA testing laboratory facilities to be made available within Karachi.

WAR is one of many NGOs lobbying and advocating for these bills to be passed and this is a significant milestone in the history of pro women legislation in Pakistan
